### **Leadership Reports**

#### **Ken Haggart, Superintendent**

- Ken presented information on the M-Step and PSAT data. Fremont led the county in the M-Step scores. Not all grades were tested in all subjects this past year. Daisy Brook scores have started to improve. Fremont's scores are steadily improving over the past five years. The State has advised that the test will

remain the same this year as last year. We are concentrating in the elementary schools on ELA and Math with 90 uninterrupted minutes of ELA during the day.

### **Bing Hanson, Director of Finance**

- Bing advised that the Finance Committee met prior to the Board meeting and watching the State budget.
- The current budget was approved with the estimate of 30 students down from last year; we are very close to that number.

### **Board Committee Reports**

- Finance/Facilities – Met tonight - Jen, Rick and Pete. Pete reported that we are waiting for the budget to be signed by Governor Whitmer. We are currently approximately 30 pupils down which is what was budgeted. Jen reported on Facilities and progress on the track. We need to extend 8 foot around the entire perimeter of the track with estimated cost of \$1.5 million. There have been drainage issues in the backyards of some people on Pine Street. Meeting on October 1 at 6:00 p.m. Next finance/facilities meeting will be October 21 at 6:00 p.m.
