Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2013-2014 educational progress for the Fremont Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. The state has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state.

Our school has been identified as a "REWARD," school.

For 2014-15, Fremont Middle School will focus on improving math scores at all levels. A title math class for our 6th graders will be offered to help improve scores. We will continue to have co-taught math classes in 7th and 8th grade and try to place students with math deficiencies in these classes along with offering a title math class at the 7th and 8th grade level if possible. We will also continue with title math reading program for all students with deficiencies in reading at all levels of the middle school.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. The current process used for assigning pupils to Fremont Middle School includes teacher recommendations from Daisy Brook Elementary and data collected from MAP, MEAP and other local assessments.

2. We are in the 3rd year of a three year school improvement plan. The plan was approved by the Michigan Department of Education, and we are currently implementing the approved plan.

3. The Core Curriculum for each Core Subject area can be accessed and reviewed at the Fremont Middle School office, or by contacting the building principal, Deb Wightman at 231 924-8135. The curriculum complies with the state standards and outcomes that are set forth by state law.

4. Aggregate achievement scores for MAP, MEAP, and all local assessments can be accessed and reviewed at the Fremont Middle School.

5. We have conferences twice a year at the middle school, approximately 65% of the parents attended either one or both of the conferences.
