- The Gerber Foundation Scholarship application will open on Wednesday, October 1, 2025, and will close on February 28, 2026, at 4 pm ET. There is a Frequently Asked Questions section to the website, which will help address questions students may have.

• Michigan Works has a Pre-Apprenticeship Career Readiness Certification program for any interested Senior that would like to explore a possible apprenticeship program after graduation. This is approximately a 90 day program for 1 to 2 hours a week which would include Career Exploration, Micro Credentials good for resume building, Work Experience, Job Shadowing, Resume Building and Interviewing Skills workshops. Students will walk away with a working portfolio and a certificate representing their work and time in the Michigan Works program helping them to be ready for an Apprenticeship. Space is limited.
