 Bing told the Board that Terry Hutchins advised her that the Consolidated App was approved.

#### **Board Committee Reports**

Finance/Personnel – Next meeting will be February 14 at 6:00 p.m.

Facilities/Policy – Met tonight. Michael advised regarding the Vaccination/Test policy which was struck down by the Supreme Court. We have an issue with a staff member and the sick bank which will be dealt with by Ken and the FEA president. There is a question regarding academic garb, and it is felt that is not a Board decision. Scott, as high school principal, will make the decision. Jen discussed the forestry issue. There have been four different people looking at the different properties. We are hoping to have more information soon. Ryan introduced Rob Golliver from OAK who will be the project manager. We had several bidders submit bids for the three different categories. The winning bids were submitted by: Andy Egan Company – Mechanical category; Shoreline Power Services – Electrical category; Nugent Construction – General Trades category. We can use Esser III and sinking fund monies for the project. Facilities is recommending the base bid plus the two alternate additions which includes a Pathfinder chiller unit.
